## Mystery of the Meaning of the Great Cube Finally Revealed!

The great cube of re-usable scaffolding and mesh, measuring $30^{\prime} \times 30^{\prime} \times 30^{\prime}$ was on display for 2 days last week in downtown Sacramento. An event was also held last Tuesday to kickoff the Cut Your Cubes campaign.

The cube was a visual representation of 1 METRIC TON of carbon dioxide gas, which is the primary greenhouse gas that causes climate change.

Every year, the average Sacramento resident generates about 10 metric tons/cubes of greenhouse emissions as carbon dioxide. This translates into about 5 tons/cubes from vehicle emissions; 4 tons/cubes from household energy; and one ton/cube from water-related energy and waste. That's 40 cubes for the average household of 4.

The goal of the Cut Your Cubes campaign is to reduce Sacramento's carbon footprint, household by household.
